

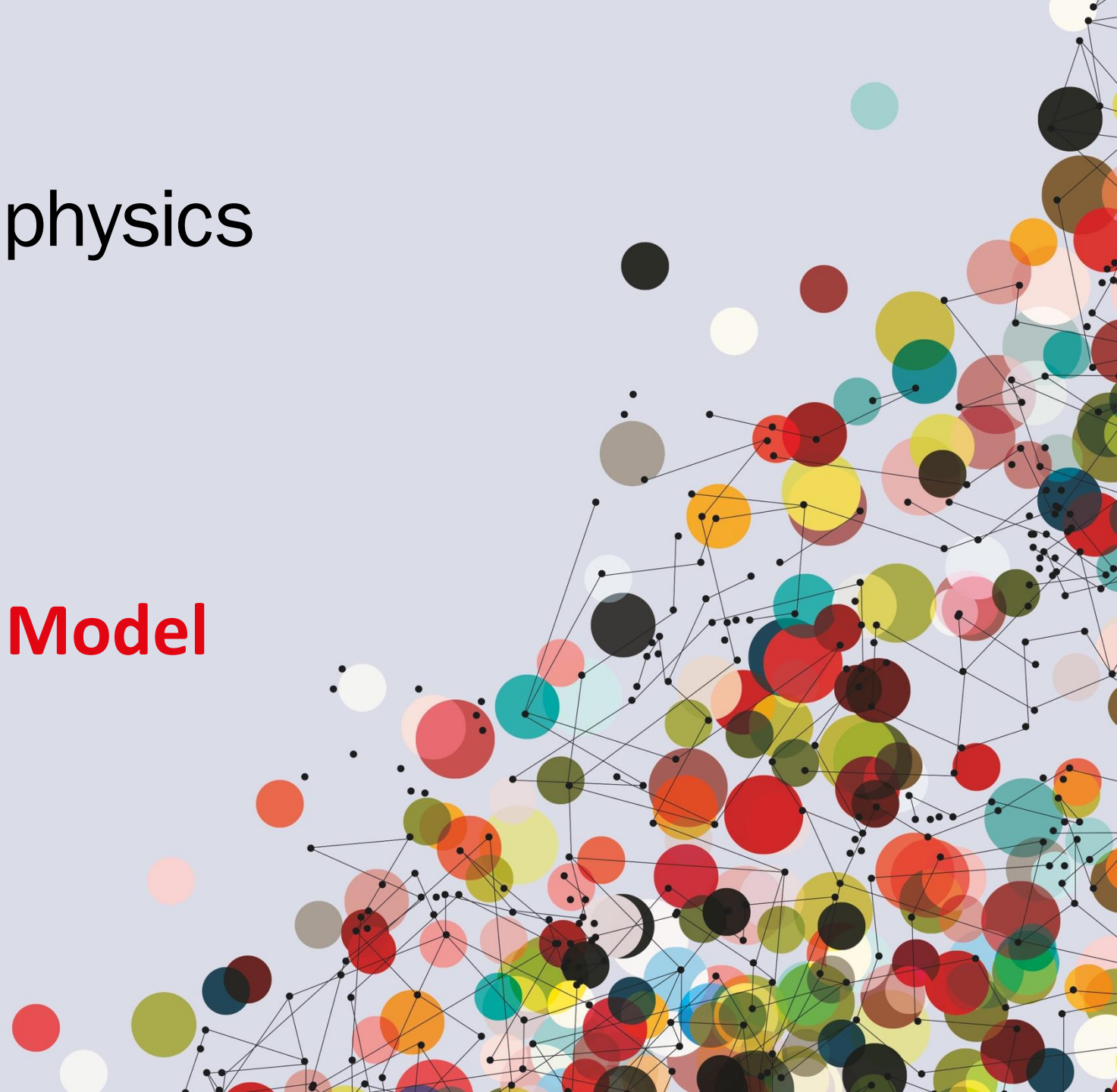

How to publish under the agreement

It's as simple as this:



How to publish under the agreement

- We identify that articles are eligible using the affiliation of the corresponding author
- To be eligible, the article should be accepted within the licence term
- During the peer-review process, or shortly after acceptance we will write to the corresponding author to let them know we will publish the article open access
- Articles are automatically opted in to open access. Although the author can still opt out, this is very rare.

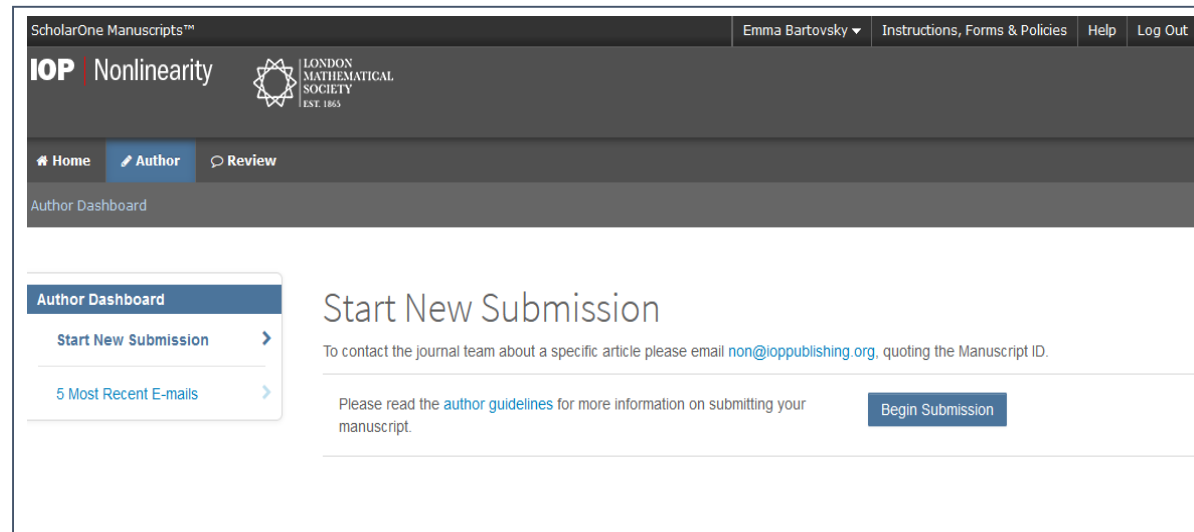


The corresponding author is the one that submits the manuscript, and is responsible for communicating with the journal during the submission, peer review and publication process.

Providing author information

Step 4: Author Information

Please enter information for **all** co-authors, ensuring names, emails and affiliations are accurate. **Changes to author lists after submission are only made in exceptional circumstances and are subject to approval by editorial staff.**

More advice and support on [adding author information](#) is available, including [who should be listed as a co-author](#), how to check if your co-author already has an account, and guidance for names with Chinese, Korean or Japanese characters.

Please do not share your login details with co-authors, who will receive their own login information if they do not already have accounts with the journal.

*For papers with more than ten authors, please add information for the first ten authors.

Open Access

This journal gives you the option to publish your article on an [open access basis](#) under a [CC BY licence](#).

Why choose open access?

- Open access articles are accessible to subscribers and non-subscribers, maximising visibility.
- Open access articles are downloaded and cited more frequently than non-open access articles on average.
- Open access publication may enable you to comply with certain funder policies.

Open Access Pricing

An article publication charge (APC) applies if you choose open access and your article is accepted for publication following independent peer review. You can visit our [paying for open access](#) pages or ask your institution/funder to see if financial support is available for open access publication.

Authors based in countries categorised by the World Bank as low income can publish open access in this journal with no APC. Eligible low-income countries (Group A) are listed on this [page](#).

Will my institution pay my fees?

We have open access agreements with institutions and funders that may cover applicable APCs at no cost to you. To see if your institution has an agreement that covers this journal, please check via our [website](#) or with your librarian. Whichever option you choose below, IOP Publishing will investigate whether you are eligible for funding and if we identify that you are, we will contact you to let you know.

After the first round of peer review, we identify eligible articles.

We'll email the corresponding author informing them of their inclusion in the agreement.

The subject line will be: 'Open access options for your article: article ID'

No opt-in action is needed.

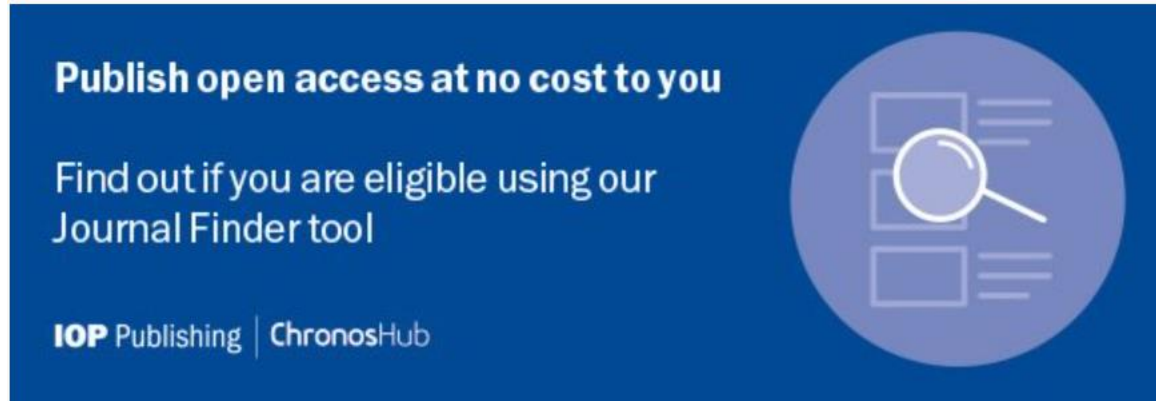


Signing copyright

The author will be asked to sign an open access copyright form and once the article is accepted it will be published open access under the terms of the institutional agreement.

Identification



- Identification is always based on corresponding (submitting) author
- We use historic submission data to inform the identification process
- Automatic - authors do not need to do anything
- We proactively sweep for missed opportunities
- Articles can be made OA retrospectively, as and when they come up – authors have to agree
- Wherever possible we make librarians aware of author opt-outs in real time

Reporting

- Quarterly reporting to ANKOS
- Full list of included articles and key metadata
- Author, Title, Journal, DOI, Accept date, Funder (if provided) etc...

Transformative agreements

Our agreements allow you to read and publish your work **open access** in the majority of IOP Publishing journals without paying article publication charges.

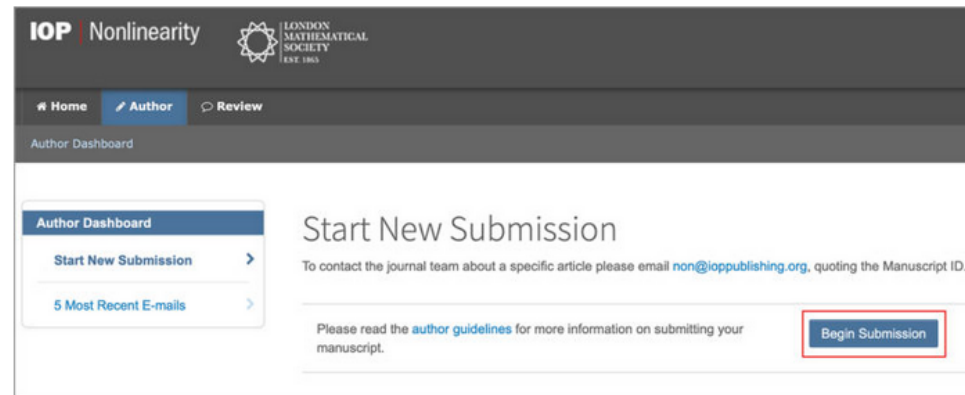

To check if your institution is covered by a transformative agreement, go to '[Transformative and institutional open access agreements](#)' and select the agreement you think you may be covered by. Each agreement page lists all of the member institutions and eligible journals.

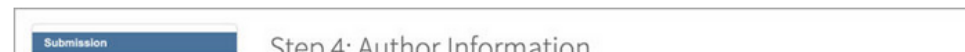
When you are ready to start your submission, follow **steps 1-4** on our submission system; ScholarOne.

Note: a small number of eligible journals do not use the ScholarOne submission system.




At **step 4** you'll be asked to enter author information. As the corresponding (submitting) author you'll need to make sure your affiliation is clearly stated on the submission form. Use the **autofill** to provide your institution name.

The corresponding author is the author that submits the manuscript, and is responsible for communicating with the journal during the submission, peer review and publication process.
